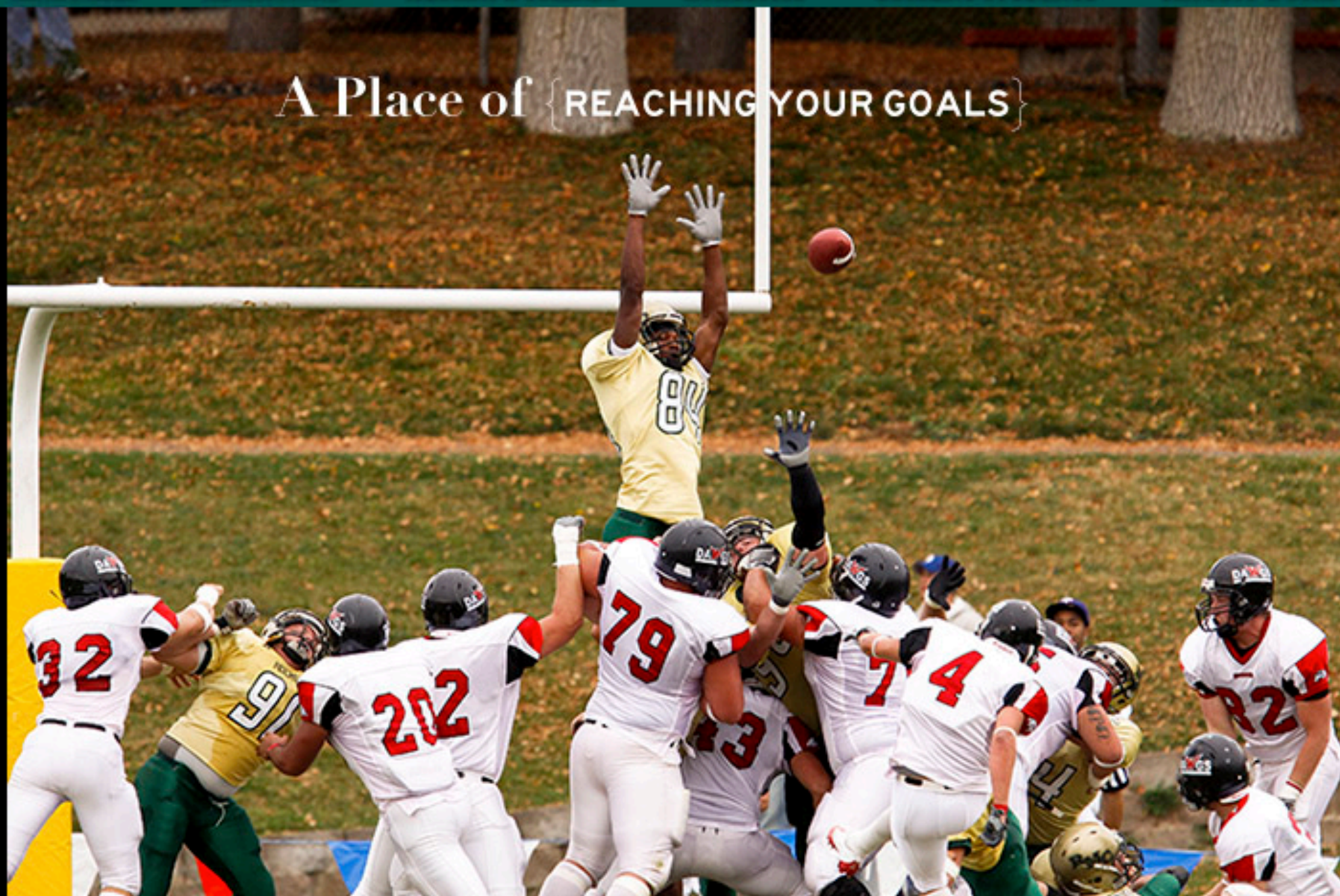

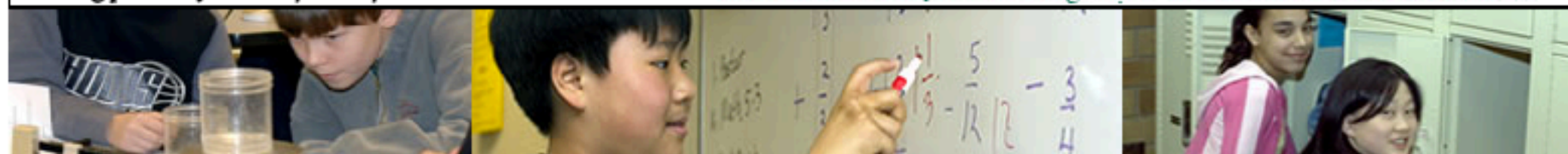

Equality

We the People
insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defence
and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution

Article I.
Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.
Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and in each State shall have Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
No Person shall be a Representative who shall not have attained to the Age of twenty five Years, and been seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and when elected, be an Inhabitant of that State in which he shall be chosen.
The whole Number of free Persons, including those bound to Service for a Term of Years, and excluding Indians not taxed, in each State shall be apportioned among the several States which may be included within this Union, according to their respective Numbers, which shall be made within three Years after the first Meeting of the Congress, and thereafter every tenth Year, in such Manner as the Congress shall direct. The Number of Representatives shall not exceed one for every thirty Thousand Persons, but each State shall have at least one Representative, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualification requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
